

Reception: Week 6

Hello everyone. We hope you are having lots of fun at home. This week we are going to base our activities on the story of 'Goldilocks and the 3 bears'.

Can you find a version of the story to read with your adult? (If you can't find one, please ask your adult to tell you the story.) We have thought of lots of activities you might choose to do around this story this story. You may choose to do them or have some other ideas of your own.

Something New to Try: The Oak National Academy has been developed by the Government and a multi-academy trust. 5 daily lessons led by teachers for all ages of children.

English Activities

Vocabulary focus: Goldilocks, house, bears, bowl, chair, bed, porridge.

Can you retell the story? Can you give the 3 bears their different voices?

Are you able to act out the story? You could start off by being Goldilocks pretending to eat the porridge, sit in the chairs, lie on the beds. I wonder what sort of face you can make when you are tasting the porridge you do not like? Now be the bears! How will you act out Daddy Bear?

Draw some pictures from the story and **write** what is happening in your pictures

Make the 3 bears a card house like this: Get a large piece of card, fold it in half so that the crease is at the top. Cut off the top corners either side to make a roof shape. Design the front of the house.

You need to think about windows and a door, will your roof have tiles or straw?

Now open your card house. Can you draw the 3 bears inside? Can you label them?

Can you draw the 3 bowls, 3 chairs and 3 beds? Can you think about the 3 sizes: small, middle

Maths Activities **If you can please also look at the PDF Goldilocks sheets**

With your **playdough** can you make the 3 different sized bowls of porridge for the bears?

With your **bricks** can you make a bed for each of the bears?

With your **Duplo** can you make some chairs?

Junk modelling: Can you use a cereal box and make the inside of the bear's house? Can you cut up some smaller boxes to make some chairs and some beds - remember there are 3 different sizes of bear.

Circle bear: Can you make a circle-bear by drawing around some different sized circles? For his tummy you can use a saucer, for his head a cup, then make his round arms and legs with 2p coins and his ears with pennies. Can you make a smaller bear or a bigger bear? Don't forget his smiley face!
