

Reception: Week 8

Hello everyone. We hope you are having lots of fun at home. This week we are going to base our activities around the story of 'The Three Little Pigs'

Can you find a version of the 'Three Little Pigs' story to read with your adult? We have thought of lots of activities you might choose to do around this story this story. You may choose to do them or have some other ideas of your own.

English Activities

Vocabulary focus: three, pigs, straw, sticks, brick, wolf, huff, puff, first, second, third.

Can you retell the story? Can you get the 1st, 2nd and 3rd little pig in the right order?

Can you act out the story? Can you do a fierce wolf's voice?

Draw the three little pig's houses. Can you write a sentence about each one?

Can you draw a big picture of the Big Bad Wolf? Can you draw a speech bubble and write inside what he says?

Picture Map: Can you get a great big piece of paper and draw each of the pigs houses and a pathway showing the route the wolf will have to take to find his way to each of the houses. Does he have to go through a wood, around a pond, up and over a hill?

Maths Activities: **If you can please also look at the pdf 3 pigs activity sheets.**

With your bricks can you make the third little pig's brick house?

With your paper and felt tip pens can you draw and cut out pig's houses.

With your paints can you paint a super big picture of the **Big Bad Wolf** and put it up in your kitchen to scare your Mum. **Don't forget his big teeth!**

Circle pig: Can you make a pig shape picture by drawing circles and triangles.

Draw around a plate for the head or use a paper plate if you have one. Cut and colour.

Draw around an upturned cup to make 3 circles, two for the eyes and one for the snout.

Colour all the circles. Use a felt tip to outline the eyeballs and the nostrils.

Draw 2 triangles, cut them out, colour them and stick them on for the ears.
