

Reception: Week 9

Hello everyone. We hope you are having lots of fun at home. This week we are going to base our activities around the story of 'The tiger who came to tea'

Can you find a version of the 'The tiger who came to tea' story to read with your adult? There is a link on the newsletter you can use if you want to, or you can find your own! We have thought of lots of activities you might choose to do around this story. You may choose to do them or have some other ideas of your own.

English Activities

Vocabulary focus: furry, stripy, tiger, tea, hungry, sandwich, teapot, milk jug, water.

Can you retell the story? Can you remember what the tiger ate first?

Can you act out the story? Can you do a purring tiger voice?

Draw the tiger drinking out of the teapot. Can you write a sentence about that?

Can you draw a big picture of the tiger waving goodbye? Can you draw a speech bubble and write inside what he says?

Learn this poem off by heart

Tiger (by Mary Ann Hoberman)

I'm a tiger

Striped with fur

Don't come near

Or I might Grrr

Don't come near

Or I might growl

Don't come near

Or I might

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When you have learnt it, can you teach it to your family?

Now look at some tigers on **the internet** or in a **book** and find out how they live in the wild.

Find out **3 tiger facts** and write them down.

Paint a tiger in the jungle.

Maths Activities:

With your bricks can you count as far as you can. Now write down all the numbers you can count. Can you write them up to 10? 20? 30? Beyond?

Practice some adding up and taking away sums. Use your bricks to help you.

Look at the tiger model template. Print it out, fold, colour and cut or use the idea and make your own.
