

## Reception: Week 10

Hello everyone. We hope you are having lots of fun at home. This week we are going to base our activities around "Dogger" by Shirley Hughes

Can you find a version of the story to read with your adult? We have thought of lots of activities you might choose to do around this story. You may choose to do them or have some other ideas of your own.

### English Activities

**Vocabulary focus:** Dogger, Dave, soft toy, lost, search, sad, race, stall, teddy, kind

**Can you retell the story?** Can you remember the story and tell your adult about it?

**Draw** some pictures from the story and **write** what is happening in your pictures.

Have you got a special soft toy? Does it go to bed with you like Dogger?

**Draw or paint** a picture of your special toy.

**Think about a 'getting lost' adventure that your toy has had or could have.** Did it get lost at the beach? Did it get lost at the shop? Did it get lost in the garden? Draw 3 pictures to tell your story. Write a sentence about each picture.

**A real dog?** Do you have a real dog at home? Think about how you would take care of a real dog. What does a dog need? What equipment would you need to look after a dog?

**Draw and label** a list of Dog equipment.

### Maths Activities / Knowledge and understanding of the world

With your **playdough** can you make a model of Dogger?

With your **bricks** can you make a bed for Dogger?

**On your trike** can you make a special carrier for your cuddly toy?

**Junk modelling:** Can you use a cereal box and make a special carriage for your soft toy to ride in?

**Duplo:** can you make a vehicle for your soft toy?

**How many legs does a dog have?** Draw 2 dogs. How many legs all together?

Draw 3 dogs. How many legs now? How many legs do you think there would be with 4 dogs?

Were you right? 5 dogs? **Try it with dogs ears.**
