



## PE and Sports Premium Funding 2013-14

The PE and Sport Premium funding is given to primary schools across England to help them improve the quality and breadth of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. Schools receive the funding based on the number of pupils in years 1 – 6. They are free to determine how best to use this funding to increase participation in PE and sport so that children can develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels of which they are capable.

For the financial year 2013 – 14, Hyde C.E. Primary School received £5,021. This was used as follows:

### Impact of the funding:

1. CPD training for staff to deliver 'Real PE' has given teachers the skills and confidence to teach the P.E. curriculum.
2. Real PE scheme of work resource has been purchased to support the teaching of the PE.
3. CPD for staff to teach gymnastics.
4. Membership of the New Forest Schools Sports Partnership, (NFSSP) and the Burgate School Sports Partnership has enabled pupils to participate in the following inter-school competitions:
  - Cross Country competitions, for all pupils in Key Stage 2, (100% participation)

- Tag Rugby competitions for all pupils in Key Stage 2, (100% participation)
- Sports Hall Athletics for all pupils in Key Stage 2
- Mini Olympics event for all pupils in Early Years and Key Stages 1 and 2, (100% participation)
- Gifted and Talented Academy run by the NFSSP attended by 50% of Year 6 pupils

All children in Years 1 – 6 have taken part in at least one inter-school competition as a result of our membership of the NFSSP and Burgate School partnerships.
